

I have worn hearing aids for a number of years, on and off. I say on and off because it has been off more with my most recent pair purchased from another provider in Venice. I had an annoying problem with feedback, which neither they nor another local provider were able to correct or alleviate. Both told me I should consider newer, more advanced models, which they would be happy to sell me. Since mine were similar, I felt they were more interested in making a sale than helping me. As a result, they wound up in my dresser drawer (not an uncommon situation.) I decided to give it one more go. A friend referred me to Blair Post at Contemporary Hearing.

What they said couldn't be done, was done by Blair.

No sales pitch on newer models; just a willingness to listen to and work with me.

After testing my hearing, he patiently worked with me to make adjustments to the programming. He also refitted the aids with new leads and cones. The ones I had were not sized or fitted properly and caused much of the feedback.

I was given a follow up appointment the next week at which time Blair fine tuned the programming and changed out one of the cones for another size. These were simple, inexpensive solutions to a fixable problem. Although I was advised of charges ahead of time, no payment was collected until I was satisfied.

Although I found Blair to have an abundance of knowledge, patience and humor, his greatest attribute is INTEGRITY. He honestly wants to help. I would recommend Blair Post and Contemporary Hearing to any person desiring to improve their hearing.

DO NOT STICK OUT YOUR TONGUE

A BLE resident recently sent me an e-mail message she was very enthusiastic about. The gist of it was that a new test had been discovered that could help determine if a person were having a stroke. Simply have them stick out their tongue. If instead of going straight out their tongue goes to one side or the other, that is an indication of stroke.

I wish I could somehow make every person who has an e-mail account repeat every morning, "If I read it in an e-mail it probably is not true."

In this case, however, it **might** be fair to say the message could be a little bit true.

The stick-out-your-tongue advice might turn out to be valid. It is based on the results of a study funded by a grant from the American Stroke Association (ASA). However, as the ASA says in its official statement, even though the initial results of the study are positive, the organization has neither taken a position on the topic nor endorsed the test. That's because the results arose from a very small study.

For the time being, the ASA emphasizes that the reliable warning signs of a stroke are:

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body.
- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking, or understanding.
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination.
- Sudden, severe headache with no known cause.

The standby method to quickly assess several of these warning signs is the "FAST" acronym.

F Face Drooping

Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile. Is the person's smile uneven?

A Arm Weakness

Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

S Speech Difficulty

Is speech slurred? Is the person unable to speak or hard to understand? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence, like "The sky is blue." Is the sentence repeated correctly?

T Time to call 9-1-1

If someone shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 9-1-1 and get the person to the hospital **<u>immediately</u>**. **Check the time** so you'll know when the symptoms first appeared.

If a stroke is involved, speed is essential in getting treatment. Clot-busting drugs can limit the effects of certain kinds of strokes, but in order to work they must be administered within three hours of the onset of symptoms.
