Please sign up at the clubhouse and mark what side dish you're supplying – vegetable, salad, dessert or other.







FLORIDA PARTNERSHIP FINALIZED

The first paragraph of the letter says, "The Partnership Registration Statement for BAY LAKE INVESTMENT CLUB, a Florida Partnership, was filed on March 6, 2017, effective on April 1, 2017. The document number assigned to this filing is GP1700000272."

Yes, it's official now. The group of friends and neighbors who got together and decided they wanted to learn about investing in the stock market has formed a legal partnership. The partnership has opened an account with a brokerage company, and has licensed specialty portfolio management software. With the completion of these steps, as a group we now are able to buy and sell stocks, each of us can monitor how our portfolio of investments is performing (both individual stocks and the aggregation of all our stocks), and we can track how much of the portfolio each partner owns.

As we were establishing the investment club, and trying to let all Bay Lakers know that they were invited to join, someone asked an insightful question. "What's the point? I wish this opportunity had been there for me twenty years ago when I could have actually taken advantage of it. But I'm already retired and, realistically, I probably don't have enough years left that I could accumulate a significant portfolio."

So... what **is** the point?

Good question. And each partner may have his or her own unique answer, so I won't presume to answer for anyone other than myself. But, for myself, here are some of the reasons I wanted to join the investment club.

Education For many years I have wanted to learn about investing, but never seemed to make the time. I was always a little embarrassed

when others would start talking about price-toearnings ratios and market sectors and earnings yield. Susan's and my approach to investing was to turn to our financial advisor and say, "Tell us what we should put our money into." Not the best approach, and we probably didn't always get the best advice.

Courage and Incentivation For the most part I hate to make financial decisions, whether it's making a large purchase or investing in a stock. The foreboding "What if I'm making a mistake?" question makes me want to put off a financial decision forever. I hope to get over that with the investment club because (1) other people are sharing in each purchase decision, so they share the blame if it turns out badly; (2) investment decisions have to be made every month since each member is contributing \$50 per month to invest; and (3) the whole purchase decision may be, for example, \$500, but my share of that investment is only \$50.

Fun It's true that I may not have the opportunity to watch the club's portfolio grow for twenty years. But I think it will be fun to watch it grow for even a relatively short period of time. I also expect there to be some fun, animated arguments over which companies we should invest in and the reasons why.

I'm sorry.

If you are now kicking yourself because you didn't take advantage of the chance to join the investment club, I'm sorry for whetting your appetite, so to speak. Per our bylaws, no new partners will be brought on board.

But that's just for the next six months while we establish our portfolio and learn a little bit about investing. After the six months we may accept applications for new partnerships, but in any case visitors are welcome to attend and participate in our meetings where you can learn about investing alongside of us.

I have worn hearing aids for a number of years, on and off. I say on and off because it has been off more with my most recent pair purchased from another provider in Venice. I had an annoying problem with feedback, which neither they nor another local provider were able to correct or alleviate. Both told me I should consider newer, more advanced models, which they would be happy to sell me. Since mine were similar, I felt they were more interested in making a sale than helping me. As a result, they wound up in my dresser drawer (not an uncommon situation.) I decided to give it one more go. A friend referred me to Blair Post at Contemporary Hearing.



EXPLORING THE MYSTERIES OF AN ANCIENT CODEX

British and Dutch scientists have used high-tech imaging to uncover the secrets of an ancient Mexican manuscript, the eScience News website reports. The manuscript, known as the Codex Seiden, is strip of deer hide five meters long that's been covered with gesso (a white plaster composed of gypsum and chalk) and folded according style to make a document 20 pages long.

It dates back to approximately 1560, and was found in what's now known as the Oaxaca region of Mexico. Like other codices from that area and others, the Codex Seiden uses brightly-colored symbols to record history: wars, genealogy, and cultural information.


One intriguing discovery: The high-tech imaging found the image of an individual represented by a glyph of a twisted cord and a flint knife. The man or woman resembles a character found in other codices, and may be an important ancestor of two families connected to other archeological sites in Mexico.



COLLISION COURSE

A huge space cloud is on a collision course with our galaxy, but don't panic—it's not expected to reach us for another 30 million years. According to NASA's Science Mission Directorate website, Smith's cloud, as it's known, is composed of enough gas to create two million stars the size of our size, and is orbiting the Milky Way at 700,000 mph.

The collision won't have much impact for anyone still around, as the cloud is much smaller than our galaxy, but scientists are watching it closely anyway, seeking explanations for its origin as well as other secrets of the universe.




