





COCONUT CARAMEL PIE

(Recipe makes 2 pies)

1/4 c. butter

1-14 oz. can Eagle Brand milk

1-7 oz. flaked coconut

16 oz. Cool Whip thawed

1/4 c. chopped pecans

2 graham cracker

9" deep dish pie shells

1-8 oz. cream cheese

1-12 oz. jar caramel ice cream topping

Melt butter in large skillet. Add coconut and pecans. Cook until golden brown, stirring frequently. Set aside

Combine softened cream cheese and Eagle Brand. Beat until smooth. Fold in Cool Whip.

Layer 1/4 cream cheese mixture in each pie shell. Drizzle caramel topping on each pie. Sprinkle 1/4 of coconut mixture on top. Repeat layers with remaining ingredients ending with coconut.

Cover and freeze until firm. Let frozen pie stand at room temperature for 10 minutes before slicing
