



NEWS FROM COMCAST

The Accessibility Home screen allows X1 customers to view and enable Accessibility settings, including Video Description and Closed Captioning (CC), find tips and tricks, reach the Support Center for Customers with Disabilities and watch Accessibility-

related content collections.

To access the Accessibility Home screen, users can say "Accessibility" into their X1 Voice Remote, or press the A button on their remote to visit the X1 Help screen, then use the down arrow to find the Accessibility tile under the Featured Support row.

4K Content on YouTube Now Available on X1
