FROM THE PRESIDENT

"No Dogs" Rule?

A resident asked me this week, "Is it true that dogs are not allowed in the pool area? It's posted in the clubhouse as a park rule, but can ELS enforce it?"

Yes, it's a park rule, but more importantly it's Florida law. Administrative Code 64E-9.004(4) states that no animals are allowed in the pool area, but that individuals with a disability and service animal trainers may be accompanied by a service animal, as defined in Chapter 413.08 of the Florida Statutes. No animals, including service animals, are allowed to enter the pool water.

These rules cover all public swimming pools, which according to 514.011 F.S. specifically include those in mobile home parks. ...continued on page 2

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


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
