#### Studying Swimming

First: Local caretaker's name and phone... and does caretaker have a key?

The Sarasota county sheriff's department actually suggests that seniors should always leave a key with a trusted friend in their neighborhood (mobile home park). The second area of the form to pay particular attention to is "yard care arrangements."

Otherwise, she's pretty much stuck with just sending in ELS's contractor and invoicing you (\$50 minimum) for the work.


#### **WOMEN'S CLUB**




