COVID STRIKES AT HOME



In early November, nearly eight months after the initial COVID-19 outbreak, the first Bay Lake resident tested positive for the virus. Due to the newsletter's holiday-accelerated publishing schedule, few details were known as the Bay Laker went to press.

What was known was that the affected resident did not participate in the usual clubhouse activities that had been restarted with preventive measures in place; she had not been coming to the swimming pool, bingo, Saturday Morning Coffee, or Association Meetings.

When she started experiencing cold-like symptoms, her daughter suggested that she get tested for the COVID virus. When the positive test results were learned, other park residents she had been around were notified. At press time, neither the extent of secondary testing nor its results were known.

Hopefully, by the time you're reading this article additional information has come to light and has been communicated through Event Alerts and possibly other channels.

While our primary concern is for the well-being of our fellow resident, this close-to-home incident forces us to acknowledge that the pandemic threat is real, requiring us to remain vigilant.

As a brief reminder, here are the recommended measures we should take to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.

• Clean our hands frequently, using soap and water for 20 seconds or a hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol.



- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Maintain the recommended 6-foot social distancing.
- Cover our mouths and noses with a mask in public settings and when around people outside of our own households —especially



when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.

- Cover any coughs or sneezes with a tissue.
- Make sure every business and organization we visit is cleaning and disinfecting frequently-touched surfaces and objects on a regular, scheduled basis.

Some people object strenuously to being required to wear masks, even though it is now generally accepted that masks may help prevent people who have COVID-19 from spreading the virus to others.

Given the extreme reactions of some mask-resisting individuals, it's probably not a good idea to confront anyone who is ignoring posted "face masks are required" signs. A safer course of action is to report such a policy violation to someone in a position of authority at the business or organization.



RECIPES

Rosemary Baumgartner

COCONUT CREAM PIE DELUXE INGREDIENTS

C Walnuts, chopped fine
C Flour
Stick butter, softened
Oz. Cream Cheese, softened
C Powdered sugar
Oz. Cool Whip
3-3/4 C Half and Half
Pkgs. Coconut Cream Pie filling/pudding (the kind you cook) 3.4 oz. each
C Shredded Coconut

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- Mix 1 stick softened butter with 1 cup flour and 1 cup chopped walnuts. Mix thoroughly. Spray lightly a 13x9 glass pan. Press mixture evenly into bottom of pan (do not press hard). Bake for 13-15 minutes depending on your oven. You just want to see slight brown on the edges. Cool Completely.
- 3. Put 1 cup shredded coconut into a small skillet and toast lightly. Set aside to cool.
- 4. Beat 1 pkg. softened cream cheese with 1 cup powdered sugar. Mix by hand then whip it for a few minutes with an electric mixer *Continued on page 9*









until fluffy. Fold in 1/3 of the cool whip into the mixture and set aside.

- 5. After crust is cool spread Cool Whip/Cream Cheese mixture onto crust using smooth strokes.
- 6. In heavy bottom pot put in both packages of coconut cream pudding and half & half, whisk. Slowly bring to a boil being careful not to burn the bottom. Set aside to cool.
- 7. Spread cooled pudding onto crust mixture. Spread the remaining Cool Whip on top.
- 8. Sprinkle with toasted coconut. Chill for at least two hours or overnight.

Keeps for days.




