
FROM THE PRESIDENT







FIGHT SPAM AND VIRUSES

How often has a friend sent an email to you and a whole bunch of other people? If all those email addresses were shown in the **To:** and/or **Cc:** boxes, that



friend unwittingly put all of you at risk...

Why You Should Use the Bcc: Feature in Email

Security and privacy experts recommend that you use the Blind Carbon Copy (**Bcc:**) feature when sending an email message to a large number of people.

Email addresses you place in the Bcc: field of a message are <u>invisible</u> to the recipients of the email. Conversely, any email addresses that you place in the To: field or the Cc: field are <u>visible</u> to everyone who receives the message.

Using the Bcc: field has a number of benefits, including the following.

- Many viruses and spam programs are now able to sniff through email files for email addresses. Using the Bcc: field acts as an anti-spam and anti-virus precaution. It reduces the likelihood that recipients will receive a spam message or a virus from another recipient's infected computer.
- The privacy of email addresses is protected in the original message. Recipients will receive the message, but won't be able to see the addresses listed in the Bcc: field.
- When an email is forwarded, the addresses of everyone in the To: and Cc: fields are also forwarded along with the message. Addresses that have been placed in the Bcc: field are not forwarded.
- If you have placed a large list of recipients in the To: or Cc: field, all of them will receive the reply. Placing recipients in the Bcc: field protects them against receiving unnecessary replies from anyone using the Reply All feature.

For all these reasons, I recommend that you use Bcc: instead of To: or Cc: whenever you send an email to more than 5 or 6 people.

If you want each recipient to know who else the email was sent to, you can include at the very beginning of your email a phrase like "This message was sent to all members of the Xyz Club."


