MIRACLES DO HAPPEN

In the year 1915, the Turkish government planned the execution and removal of countless Armenians from their homes and villages. The Armenian people occupied dozens of villages spread across a region inside Turkey. 1.5 million men, women and children were murdered as proven in the book, "The Armenian Genocide." The following testimony, and many others, have become a part of that history.

They placed my grandmother, Khanum Palootzian, age 21, on the death march (where they walked till they dropped) with no food, water or clothing. If you google her name, her personal account, along with my dad, Zakaria, and his brother, Mesrob testimonies are on the NET on the same page.

Khanum's daughter, strapped to her back, died of malnutrition along that treacherous march. Her unborn child, my mother, Doris, was safe inside her womb.

Many days later Khanum arrived at a village and a Danish missionary, Karin Petersen, recognized Khanum from having helped Karin at an orphanage years before the Genocide. So, Karin Petersen pulled her inside the missionary to save Khanum and her unborn child and gave them safe refuge. My mother was born at that missionary.

The above account was included in the book, "Diaries of a Danish Missionary" (google this) authored by Maria Jacobson, a Danish missionary. The Danish missionaries scattered throughout Armenia were responsible for saving the lives of thousands of Armenian children during that awful period in history. My mother was saved that dreadful day thanks to the attention of Karin Petersen. Miracles really do happen!

This photo and information about our Community was included with that flier so I felt it was kind of important for folks to review since it is sort of nostalgic.




