

MY FAVORITE EASY RECIPE

HAM GLAZE

for a 10-12 lb ham, sliced or unsliced

- 1 cup light brown sugar
- ½ to ¾ cup of pineapple or orange juice
- ½ cup of honey;
- 1-2 tbl of Dijon Mustard;
- 1/3 to ½ jar of Peach or Apricot Preserves (not ' jam); 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ tsp cloves
- optionally, a splash or two of Grand Marnier Liquor.

Bring the ingredients to a boil on medium heat, stirring constantly with a wire whisk, then allow to cool down (it will thicken) before glazing your ham. If you refrigerate the glaze the day before, simply warm it up in a sauce pan then allow it to cool.

I always heat the Ham in a roasting pan with water below the rack on the bottom, covered! with foil for about 1.5 to 2 hours (depending on ! the weight) at 275 degrees. Glazed three times, beginning-middle-and lightly at the end. The water helps retain the ham's moisture.

On 08/14/2022, 60 Minutes aired a special segment, featuring billionaire Pete Kadens. They titled this "Calling All Billionaires." According to the show, Pete spends about 15 million per year sending low-income students to college, tuition free. He calls it, "Hope College." Much like Howard Buffett, Pete Kadens wants to change people's lives and his goal in life is to use his billions to help those who are less fortunate.

Pete and his family are currently the controlling owners of a business called "Headbands of Hope," a fashionwear business that leverages the one-for-one model to **donate** hair accessories to pediatric patients who are ill and impoverished.

I'm going to step out in faith and say something we all know to be true, "It Takes Money to Make Money." These folks certainly did just that and now, they use their money to help others. MIRACLES DO HAPPEN

Our generation is very familiar with baseball legend, Jackie Robinson, and the history surrounding his difficult climb for recognition within the baseball league. I doubt, however, if many folks in our generation will recognize the name, Althea Gibson.



Althea Neale Gibson (August 25, 1927 – September 28, 2003) was an American tennis player and professional golfer, and one of the first Black athletes to cross the color line of international tennis.

In 1956 Althea won the French Open (tennis). In 1957 she won the Australian Open (tennis). She won the US Open (tennis) two consecutive years in 1957 and 1958. For three consecutive years she took home the trophy for winning Wimbledon (tennis) in 1956, 1957 & 1958.



In 1963, tennis star Althea Gibson became the first black female to play on the LPGA tour, making a massive impact on the game along the way.

To kick off the 2019 US Open Tennis tournament,
