<u>BE PREPARED</u> (the original Boy Scout motto from 1907)

BePrepared.com also sells a large variety of MRE's, meals-ready-to-eat, which I found to be rather tasty and convenient, when you don't feel like cooking.

#### MY FAVORITE FILM OR TV SHOW

Please read "Miracles Do Happen" in this newsletter for a live interview between Sharyn Alfonsi of 60 Minutes and 15 year-old, Jacob Smith, a blind skier.

#### MIRACLES DO HAPPEN

In the world of skiing, there are two kinds of skiers. Those who like to stay on groomed runs and be guided gently *around obstacles* and those who like to ski the whole mountain and ski towards the obstacles. *This is called freeriding*. Man-made jumps, rails and half pipes are rejected in favor of the drops, jagged cliffs, and deep chutes created by mother nature.

The sport of freeriding took off in the 1990's and is now one of the fastest-growing disciplines in skiing. Given the risks inherent with the terrain, it attracts some of the bravest and most adventurous skiers in the world. But - as first reported on 60 Minutes last March - even among that group, 15-year-old Jacob Smith, a blind skier stands out. I thought you should see what he does, because he cannot. Just **google** 60 Minutes and click on the 60 Minutes link, then click on the search box and type in the name, Jacob Smith – and watch and see for yourself.

And that is Jacob Smith who is blind. Three years ago, he was just 12 years old as he made his way to the top of the 11,000 foot high lone peak, in Big Sky, MT., to ski down it.

Michael says, "I lived at the base of lone peak in a rented Condo for 9 months in 2016-2017 and I know for a fact that is a very steep mountain."

Jacob drops into the Big Couloir – a narrow, rock-



walled, 1,400 foot chute. That dot you see in a photo is him... making his way turn by turn. A wrong move can be catastrophic. The run has a 50-degree slope, which means if you slip down the couloir, there is little chance you can stop yourself.

"When you're standing at the top, you feel like if you move, you're gonna die," said Jacob.

Jacob Smith: "Yeah, but I'm kinda just, like, well, I'm already up here, so I've gotta make it (LAUGHING) down somehow."

He did. And became the <u>only legally blind athlete</u> to ski the legendary run.

Sharyn Alfonsi: "How did you feel when you made it to the bottom?"

Jacob Smith: "Excited that I did it. I didn't crash. I thought it was awesome. And then-- I guess we made it four more times, so I just (LAUGH) wanted to do it again."

Jacob is still testing his luck and good sense. We (60 minutes) met him in January 2022 at a junior regional freeride tournament in Big Sky, MT. He's now 15 years old, competing against 40 other teenage daredevils, all of whom can see perfectly well.

This time, the background for all of the competitors' spectacular experiment with gravity was another triple diamond chute, appropriately named D.T.M.

Sharyn Alfonsi: "D.T.M. stands for ...?"

Jacob Smith: "Don't Tell Mama." (LOL)

Sharyn Alfonsi: "It is an insane run. Like, a 45 degree slope."

Jacob Smith: "Yeah."

Sharyn Alfonsi: "Do the judges give you any slack for being blind?"

Jacob Smith: "No. Zero."

Sharyn Alfonsi: "Do you think they should?" Jacob Smith: "No! I don't. I wanna be treated normal so I compete with other sighted skiers."

It's not an insignificant difference. We (60 minutes) worked with his doctors and our graphic artist to show roughly what Jacob can see on a run. He has extreme tunnel vision – and no depth perception on top of that – it's blurry – his visual acuity is rated 20/800, four times the level of legal blindness. Think of the big E on the eye chart. He would need it to be blown up four times in order to see it from 20 feet away.

So how does Jacob ski like this? His family keeps him on course.

On competition day, his little brother, Preston, patiently helps him hike to the top of the venue. It's so high, the lifts won't take you there.

Then his father, Nathan, helps him get down.

Jacob has a two-way radio turned up high in his pocket. His dad is on the other end at the base, somehow, calmly, guiding him down.

Nathan Smith: "It's on me to make sure I don't let him down, that I get him in trouble, you know, that I-- I have to guide him through narrower chutes or not go off a cliff."

Sharyn Alfonsi: "You have to be his eyes."

Sharyn Alfonsi: "You're more afraid of not succeeding than you are of getting hurt?"

Jacob Smith: "Yes."

Sharyn Alfonsi: "Why is that?"

Jacob Smith: "Because I've already lost my vision, so a couple broken bones and a couple more mishaps, I guess, isn't a big deal to me at all."

On competition day, Jacob suits up and sends it, finishing 19th out of 41 competitors. For Jacob, success isn't about the trophy, it's about freedom. Showing others how to negotiate obstacles, even when you can't see them coming.

Okay, this restaurant is NOT closeby, but if ever you are in or near Minnesota, you must visit the OWAMNI RESTAURANT, named

the Best New Restaurant in the United States by the James Beard Foundation. The Owamni is located at 420 1st St. S. Minneapolis, MN 55401. A polished restaurant specializing in Indigenous Cuisine, including tacos, sandwiches & salads.

In the summer of 2021, Sean Sherman, a forty-eightyear-old Oglala Lakota chef, opened a restaurant in Minneapolis, and called it Owamni,

Nearly overnight, his restaurant became the most prominent example of Indigenous American cuisine in the United States. Every dish is made without wheat flour, dairy, cane sugar, black pepper, or any other ingredient introduced to this continent after Europeans arrived. Sherman describes the food as "decolonized"; his business partner and Owamni's co-owner, Dana Thompson, calls it "ironically foreign."






