Elections 2024

New Cable Package

1. Our new cable programming has been available for viewing since January 1st

Park Safety/Security

The Assassination of President John F Kennedy *cont'd from December...*

Jacquelynn Lueth is executive producer of the new Paramount+ Original documentary, "JFK: What the Doctors Saw," which brings to light stunning revelations from doctors who were in the E.R. on the day of President John F. Kennedy's assassination.

This is what she had to say...

“November 22, 1963, is a date defined by, I will never forget. Sent home from school alone, frightened and attached to the TV, the day unfolded before me that even by today's standards was too much, too fast and too sad to grasp the entirety of what went down. My commitment to understanding it moved from passive to active many years later when Dr. Lawrence Klein, one of my personal physicians introduced to me by mom, told me that on Nov. 22, 1963, he was a third-year medical student at UT Southwestern, doing a rotation at Parkland Memorial Hospital, and was in the emergency room when President John F. Kennedy was brought in. His hope was that his recollection, a shared moment in history, could be recorded as part of his legacy for his grandchildren. At first, we talked about his role, taking the president into Trauma Room One, alerting the chief of neurosurgery, and wheeling wounded Texas Governor John Connolly on what would become the "magic bullet" gurney. As my background is in television, our talk quickly moved from an idea for a book to a documentary and a plan to contact the other surviving doctors who were in the ER that day. At that point, I had no preconceived perceptions or theories. With the luxury of more than 50 years of data and testimony, my research I began in the present and I worked my way backwards.

I videotaped interviews with seven of the doctors. We reached out to Dr. Malcom Perry, the attending surgeon in charge, and Dr. Kemp Clark, the chief of neurosurgery, but due to health issues neither was able to participate. The interviews were conducted individually and then I brought them together as a group. It was the first time since the day of the assassination that they had been reunited.

Their recollections were precise and clear, as if the intervening decades had melted away. Each of them reacted strongly when the autopsy pictures were projected on a screen. They didn't agree on everything, but it became obvious that the way the president looked at Parkland did not match the

autopsy photos taken at Bethesda even before the official autopsy began.

Besides the doctors, I did several other interviews. Among these were Jim Jenkins, the only surviving member of the autopsy team, whose observations I wanted to compare with those of the Parkland doctors, and also Robert Tanenbaum, the original deputy chief counsel for the House Select Committee on Assassinations, who helped clarify what was told and not told to the public. He quit the committee because he felt they weren't conducting a real search for truth.

My husband, Bill Garnet, and I have continued our research for over 15 years, which has led us to the following conclusions: The doctors at Parkland had extensive experience in treating gunshot wounds and had no agenda other than trying to save the president's life. Those who saw the wound in the president's neck believed it was an entrance wound. Several of them saw a gaping hole in the back of JFK's head.

The government did everything it could do to negate, intimidate and threaten the Parkland doctors because their observations contradicted the single "magic bullet" theory of the Warren Commission. Based on this, I concluded that there had been a cover-up and the public had not been told the truth."

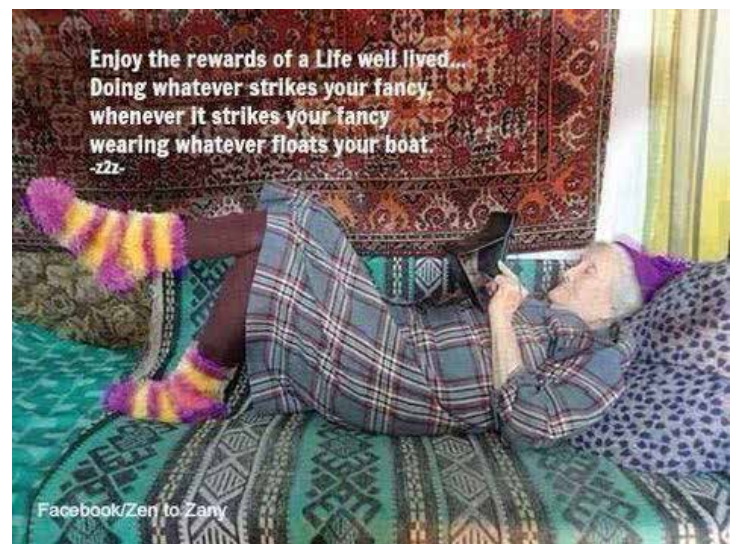

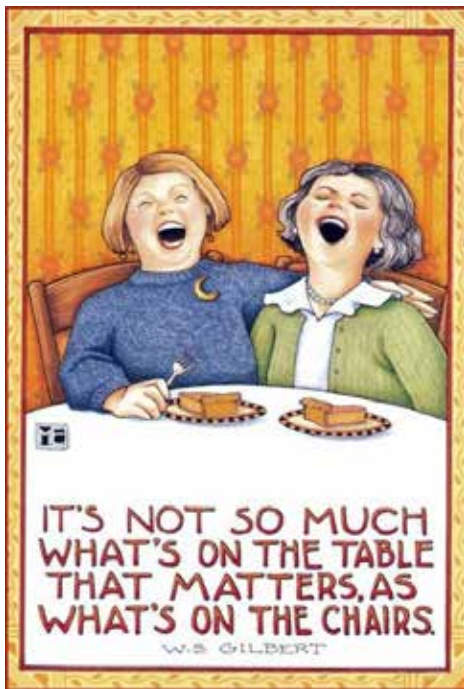

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MIRACLES DO HAPPEN

December 21, 2023 - A California man who became trapped on the side of a cliff for days was finally rescued by first responders after a daring, nearly 24-hour rescue effort. Rescue crews finally freed the man on Friday morning after he had been trapped in a hole for days near the side of the Sunset Cliffs in San Diego, California, the San Diego Union-Tribune reported.

The rescue effort took about 19 hours, and first responders with the San Diego fire department (SDFD) described the extrication as “treacherous”. “The location of this rescue [was] very treacherous for rescuers as well as the patient,” the fire department said in an update to social media.

The man reportedly slipped and fell under broken rocks near the side of the cliff, and he later became wedged in a small crevice.

The man was trapped from the waist down in a hole only 18in wide, ABC News reported. The size of the hole was an additional challenge for rescuers, the SDFD added on social media.

The man reportedly told rescuers that he had been trapped under the rocks for at least three days, the local television news station KGTV reported.

On Thursday, a group of teenagers heard the man crying out for help, and they called 911, the Union-Tribune reported.

Rescuers first arrived to the scene at about 4pm Pacific standard time. Authorities with the SDFD and the Chula Vista fire department worked to free

the man but had to pause the rescue effort overnight due to rising tides and inclement weather.

The man was given blankets and received fluids intravenously to combat dehydration, the Union-Tribune reported.

But rescuers say that the high tide combined with rain and wind brought up an additional concern: the possibility of the man drowning.

“Drowning was a concern for us ... Our tides showed us that it wasn’t going to go over his head ... But we did know that [water] was filling that bottom cavity in the cave where his legs were caught in between,” the San Diego fire-rescue deputy chief of operations, Dan Eddy, said to the Union-Tribune in a post-rescue update.

Using micro-explosives, rescuers were able to break up the heavy rocks and dislodge the man, the Union-Tribune reported.

The man was freed at about 11 am on Friday and was taken to a local hospital for further evaluation. He reportedly sustained injuries, but he was awake and alert at the time of the rescue and thanked crews who helped free him.

Right around the corner from Bay Lake Estates is TWO ROOSTERS FUSION – A Portuguese/Latin BBQ restaurant, sporting a *very eclectic menu* like no other



Latin restaurant with a Portuguese/Latin BBQ twist. Indoor/outdoor seating is available and judging from the looks much thought went into the decor, making this a very special place to take family and friends.

Upon my 2nd visit I ordered the chicken enchilada plate that came with the best Mexican rice and beans (unlike re-fried beans) I've had in years. Unusual, yet very tasty spices makes this plate simply delicious. On my 3rd visit (12/28) I ordered the Portuguese Piri Piri BBQ Chicken and it was perhaps the best tasting chicken I ever had – juicy, fork tender, and *fall off the bone* bursting with flavor. I mean flavor-town all the way. Cooked with Portuguese spices then basted with Piri Piri sauce. This dish is a must try. And, the Texas style potato salad is unlike any potato salad I've ever eaten – simply yummy stuff. On my 4th visit I ordered the 2 taco dinner that came with rice and Frijoles Borrachos beans (delicious stuff). The Chef must have grilled the flour tortilla for a minute since that gave the tortilla just enough crunch to enjoy biting into it.

Their burgers made with a blend of ground chuck, brisket and short ribs sounds very interesting, which I plan to try on a subsequent visit.

One of our residents claimed the service needed improving. I usually get my food to go since BLE is several minutes away. The night I was there a DJ was setting up equipment to play music. He also said they plan to host a Karaoke night and a Trivia night soon. Directions: Turn left at Captain Eddie's then get ready to turn right at the first immediate driveway.

Getting yelled at?

Do you think that your spouse is yelling at you more often than usual? If you said yes, you are not alone in this. We recently had George come in and asked for adjustments to his hearing aids. I ask why and he said, "my wife is yelling at me morning and night."

I must have looked confused so he explained. He said, "When I last saw you I remember getting coffee in the morning and my wife came in with a booming voice asking me something. I told her I heard her and she didn't need to yell. She laughed and said something like well there's a first time for everything. This morning she said something to me and I missed it. Then she looked me right in the eyes and said so slowly and loudly, "Go ask Blair to help you.. and me."

I didn't need to adjust his hearing aids in the way he was thinking. I didn't need to make them louder. I just needed to do a cleaning. The skin debris and wax particles will clog both the speaker and the mic screen. If the mic isn't taking in sounds then he can't catch what his wife said. Or if the speaker is clogged then no sound can be transmitted at a volume you can hear, then she will need to yell.

If you feel like everyone is yelling at you, or you are the one yelling. Please know that we can help make talking to each other easier. Call for an appointment to determine if the hearing aids need a cleaning, repair or service.
