THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Park Updates:

- 1. The installation of the 6 additional street lights has now been completed.
- 2. The storm sewer box has been replaced on Bay Lake Blvd.
- 3. The office has contacted the contractor again for the sinking on Gardenia St, urging them to inspect as soon as possible.
- 4. An engineer completed a waterflow and elevation study to repair the lake erosion. The proposal has been received. The project includes bank and asphalt repairs, and installation of a curb/gutter system around the perimeter of the lake to direct the water flow to the spillways. Hopefully, the repairs will be done in the next couple months.
- 5. A new parking policy is being developed for the overflow parking area. Although not finalized yet, some of the changes being considered may include:
 - 1. registration with the office for all vehicles to obtain a 48-hour parking pass;
 - 2. overflow parking for temporary use only and for pool and clubhouse use;
 - 3. residents with multiple vehicles and no room in their driveways may be required to obtain storage off-site.

The office requires an email address for each household as they will start using email blasts as another form of communication with park residents. Phone calls will continue to be used for emergencies or notices for water shut-off, etc.

By the time you read this, St. Patrick's Day 2024 has already passed, but the memory of a fun filled day and/or an event is never over. You see, when I lived in Savannah, GA for 7 years I did attend their St. Paddy's Day

parade – twice. Savannah hosts the second largest St. Patrick's Day parade in the nation, about one million visitors each year, 2nd only to New York. This is the parade of parades with more bells and whistles than one can imagine.

If you plan to attend you might want to think about booking a room one to two years in advance and I would stay downtown at a B & B or Hotel so you can walk everywhere and to a location where you have a front row seat to watch this famous event. Parking is non-existent during this event so don't even think about it.

With only a 6-hour drive from Nokomis, Savannah is closer than you think. And, there is plenty to do and see in this fun filled city beginning with a trolly ride around town to see and hear the history of homes and buildings and of course all the famous town squares.

If you plan to stay at a Hotel, try booking a room at the 1790 Inn & Restaurant. If you request room 204 you might get to meet Anne, the ghost that many guests have seen in this room. This Inn sports some of the best Margarita's in their bar.

Aside from great restaurants, like my favorite, The Olde Pink House (the scored flounder is to die for), Elizabeth's on 37th St., a five star restaurant, a British Pub, Six Pence Pub on Bull St., Green Truck Pub, Mrs. Wilkes Dining Room on W. Jones Street serves up family style fried chicken with more trimmings/ side dishes than one can imagine, or City Market offers the best pizza in Savannah at Vinnie Van Go Go's. For world class BBQ try Wiley's BBQ (they win best BBQ every year in Savannah), a short jaunt from downtown, and Savannah's Seafood Shack (on the way to Tybee Island) for the best Low Country Boil you'll ever have. Then we have the Crystal Beer Parlor, The Pirate's House and other notable dining establishments. Forget about eating at Paula Dean's restaurant. Too much hype-not enough flavor.

Other notable sites to visit would be historic Pin Point, the home of Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas. Emancipated slaves first swam to Pin Point, pooled their money together, bought land and started a thriving crabbing business. You can walk around this small area and examine the inside of several crabbing buildings, view videos and listen to recordings of those crabbing days.

Next month we'll explore Charleston, a short drive from Savannah.

MIRACLES DO HAPPEN

You've seen her recently in the news. 29 year old Cole Brauer is now labelled the first American woman to sail SOLO around the world non-stop.

A CORUNA, Spain (AP) — Alone, Cole Brauer braved three oceans and the elements as she navigated her sailboat for months.

When she and her 40-foot (12.2-meter) sailboat arrived Thursday in A Coruna, Spain, the 29-year-old became the first American woman to race nonstop around the world by herself, traveling across about 30,000 miles (48,280 kilometers).

Brauer, all of 5-foot-2 (1.6-meter) and 100 pounds

(45.4 kilograms) of her, is one of more than a dozen sailors competing in the Global Solo Challenge. Brauer



was the youngest and only woman in the group that set sail in October from A Coruna.

The starts were staggered. Brauer took off on Oct. 29. As of Thursday, some in the field had dropped out of the race.

The race took Brauer south along the west coast of Africa, around the Cape of Good Hope and then eastward toward Australia. From there, she continued east where Brauer faced the unpredictable, treacherous and deadly Cape Horn at the southern tip of South America before continuing northeast across the Atlantic Ocean toward Spain.

The race took her 130 days to complete. She finished in 2nd place.

While Brauer is the first American woman to race around the globe alone by sea, she is not first woman to do so. Polish sailor Krystina Chojnowska-Liskiewicz finished her 401-day voyage around the globe on April 21, 1978, according to online sailing sites.

Kay Cottee of Australia was the first woman to achieve the feat nonstop, sailing off from Sydney Harbor in Australia in November 1987 and returning 189 days later.

The global voyage is not an easy one, even on a vessel with a full crew.

"Solo sailors, you have to be able to do everything," Brauer told the NBC "Today" show Thursday. "You need to be able to take care of yourself. You need to be able to get up, even when you're so exhausted. And you have to be able to fix everything on the boat."

Along the way she encountered 30-foot (9.1-meter) waves that tossed her about the boat, according to NBC News. She injured a rib and even gave herself an IV to fend off dehydration.

Sailing solo means not just being a skipper but a project manager, said Marco Nannini, the race's organizer. That means steering the vessel, making repairs, knowing the weather and keeping yourself healthy, he said.

"The biggest asset is your mental strength, not the physical one," Nannini said. "Cole is showing everyone that."

One of Brauer's social media posts from Dec. 8 showed her frustration.

"I haven't really had the bandwidth to get into everything that's been going on the past 48 hours, but the short version is the autopilot has been acting up again and I needed to replace some parts and do a rudder recalibration," she wrote. "For once the light air is actually helping, but it's been exhausting, and I'm sore and tired."

"It's all part of the journey, and I'm sure I'll be feeling better once the work is done and I've gotten some sleep," Brauer added. "But right now things are tough."

But she's handled the tough, even though some in the sport believed it wouldn't be possible due to her gender and small frame.

"I push so much harder when someone's like, 'no, you can't do that,' or 'you're too small," Brauer said.

"It would be amazing if there was just one other girl that saw me and said 'Oh, I can do that, too," she added.

THE SAUCE IS THE BOSS at Two Roosters...

Numerous local restaurants offer BBQ ribs on their menu, but not too many places offer smoked BBQ ribs, perfectly cooked in the smoker with unending flavor. With or



without BBQ sauce, this is by far the best BBQ ribs this side of the Mississippi.

The controversy surrounding ribs is simply this; which rib meat is better, Baby back ribs or St. Louis ribs? Okay, baby back ribs are leaner, but is leaner better?

I answered this question when I first ordered ribs at <u>Two Roosters</u> (right around the corner from BLE – left at Captain Eddie's). After taking my first bite I thought to myself 'this is how great ribs should taste'. Tender, juicy, smokey and oh so good. Seasoned and smoked to perfection. Their scratchmade sauce is finger licking good.

If you want a *great* rib dinner try their 6 bone or 12 bone-full slab rib dinner and you'll have plenty to share with others or for a few more meals in the following days. This meal comes with two sides of your choosing. I ordered BBQ Peach Baked Beans and Collard Greens. For sure, this is my all-time favorite place for BBQ Ribs. The new flavor-town is here and about ³/₄ mile around the corner from BLE. In the words of a Tina Turner song, "simply the best."
