#### Park Updates:

1. Lake project: The contract is done. The funding is in the process of being approved. We should see work on this soon.
2. Island Lights: We also received funding approval for repairs to the entrance island lights as well as repairs to the shuffle board electrical. Work will begin soon.
3. Hurricane season: Predictions call for a well above average season. A reminder for seasonal residents to put things away, including flower pots.
4. Departure Form: A reminder that everyone needs to fill out the departure form when they leave the park. This includes snowbirds when they leave, as well as permanent residents going on vacation. The office needs to know how to reach you at all times in the event of an emergency.
5. Gardenia Street: The street has been inspected and the vendor will provide a report to management shortly on work/repairs required.
6. HOA Rummage Sale Shed: It has been confirmed by park management that the shed belongs to the HOA. The HOA Shed Repair Committee has completed Phase I of the repairs (flooring and door frame). The shed can now be used by the 2025 Rummage Sale Committee. Further repairs will be considered after the 2025 Rummage Sale.
7. Clubhouse/Pool Parking: A friendly reminder that the overflow parking is for temporary use only, and primarily intended for the pool and clubhouse use.

### **SCAM of the YEAR**

We all know there are countless scams happening on a daily basis to more people than we can count. We hear it on the news, the radio, or from someone we know, etc. If you don't believe me just call the FBI Fraud hotline at 833-372-8311 and listen to the various voice prompts offering a number of selections to fit your Fraud needs.

However, a potential fraud does become personal when it happens to us. Later we may feel guilty or that perhaps we were naïve without intentionally being naïve. You're not alone. This can happen to the best of us.

The following are true events as I recall – step by step, very similar to the recent film *The Beekeeper*, starring Jason Statham.

On Tuesday, March 26th, I was the victim of an attempted scam – in a big way, at the tune of \$6,800.00. It all started when I received an email from a **legitimate** email address; service@paypal.com (I found this out later after calling PayPal). After reading the email I thought nothing of it since I didn't make the alleged purchase of \$340 using my PayPal account. It wasn't until hours later when I received a second email of a second \$340 purchase did it sink in that perhaps I better look into this. The email did indicate the following message: Reach us at +1 (802) 613-7928 (**DO NOT CALL THIS NUMBER**), if this was not you so I called the

number to report that both purchases were not mine. Low and behold the person helping me offered me a refund of \$680 but first, I had to fill out a refund form on line with their guidance. In order to fill out the form I had to allow them access, to my computer in order for the form to appear on my screen, remotely, with the use of a software download. I thought it was legitimate so I stupidly granted permission to access my computer. I sat and watched as this form magically appeared on my screen asking for certain personal items, such as name, address, etc.

When it was my turn to fill in the blanks I had control of my mouse. When it came to filling out the line for the amount of the refund I mis-typed \$680 and wrote \$640. I then saw an error message to correct that mistake. So, I went back and re-typed in \$680 but immediately the \$680 changed to \$6,800 before my eyes. The gal I was talking with said it was my mistake so I demanded to speak to her manager - some guy named Martin. Martin said that my keyboard key had stuck and it typed in two zero's. I piped up that I didn't do that-that someone on their end who had control of their mouse typed that number in, which they did not believe.

I was then asked to log into my bank account to verify the amount of the refund, and I did. I was then asked did I see the refund amount of \$6,800 from PayPal in my account and I replied, YES. Now I was told I had to repay \$6,120 immediately since their job was on the line and that the funds belonged to their employer, PayPal. I was given clear instructions by this gal, who all along, I thought was a customer service rep of PayPal, to run to Winn Dixie and purchase eight \$250 Sephora gift cards for a total of \$2,000, as a sign of good-will that it was truly my intention to replace the funds. I was told to do this three days in a row since the daily limit at Winn Dixie was \$2,000, verses Publix who has a daily limit of \$500 for gift cards.

At this point it was about 6:30 and I was hungry and politely said I would do this after dinner plus I had an important zoom meeting call at 7:00 p.m. that

evening. Martin screamed at me to do it now that his job and her job was at stake. I agreed. Martin then told me to keep my phone on and take it with me to Winn Dixie to confirm I had made the gift card purchase. I was also given specific instructions NOT TO USE my credit card or a check but to use my debit card instead. Before refusing to follow their instructions, I logged into my bank account using my cell phone and they had no idea I was doing that. When I reviewed my account using my phone I did not see the \$6,800 transfer from PayPal and immediately it hit me that this entire thing was a total SCAM – the SCAM of the year. So, I hung up and they kept calling me for hours, which I ignored, including the next day when I was at my bank changing/deleting my accounts.

This is what I believe they did after I logged into my bank. They most likely simulated the bank's page on their end to instantly reflect the transfer of \$6,800 from PayPal to me because I was logged into the same account with my phone and did not see the transaction. The deposit WAS FAKE, perhaps computer generated.

After sharing the above scenario the next day with a former resident of BLE, she told me the same thing happened to her after moving to Georgia and she was told to obtain BitCoins at a certain location near her, which she did. She became a victim of a similar scam and was out a substantial amount of money.

Steps to take if you believe you may be the victim of a fraudulent email.

- 1) Never, ever, click on an email link if you suspect anything awry.
- 2) If it's after banking hours, have an emergency number for your BANK ready.
- 3) Place a lock immediately on all your accounts after an attempted fraud.
- 4) Call your banker (if they're open) and make an appointment to close and change all your accounts.
- 5) Do not allow people access to your computer or other device, remotely.

6) DO NOT LOG INTO your bank account with them watching via the remote software. They will STEAL your user name and password, just like in the film The Beekeeper.

7) If using your computer or tablet to log into your bank, use your cell phone app to confirm that the funds did or did not transfer into your account.

8) HANG UP, then pull the power cord from your computer!!!!

## **TOTAL ECLIPSE 2024**

Susan Marie, an amateur photographer, was in one of the best positions in the world to witness this rare event as she currently lives in Arkansas which was in the direct path of the astronomical phenomenon. She describes the moment: "It went completely silent, there were no birds, no animals, then about two minutes into it we could hear some crickets and that was it."



"It was really eerie, as soon as the sun went back out everything went back to normal.

It was a once-in-a-lifetime experience, it left you speechless."

A woman from Jersey says seeing the total solar eclipse was a "once-in-a-lifetime experience". An eclipse happens when the moon moves in front of the sun and it travels along a 'path of totality' which means scientists can forecast where it will be seen from and for how long. This rare phenomenon was visible to an estimated 44 million people across the United States and Mexico.

Susan adds: "It was around 12:30 pm when the moon started going over the sun and further into it, the temperature then dropped by 8 to 10 degrees and it started getting a bit darker. It was amazing, we had four minutes and 18 seconds of darkness. I had my daughter with me and we watched it together, then as soon as it was done I went back to work. It was much better than what we were expecting. The next sighting is in 2045 and that is coming through us as well."

## THE HUMANE THING TO DO

WHO SAID "SHOOT ALL THE LAWYERS"?

Mr. Stevenson is a widely acclaimed public interest lawyer who has dedicated his career to helping the poor, the incarcerated, and the condemned.



Bryan Stevenson is the founder and Executive Director of the Equal Justice Initiative, a human rights organization in Montgomery, Alabama. Under his leadership, EJI has won major legal challenges eliminating excessive and unfair sentencing, exonerating innocent death row prisoners, confronting abuse of the incarcerated and the mentally ill, and aiding children prosecuted as adults.

Mr. Stevenson has argued and won multiple cases at the United States Supreme Court, including a 2019 ruling protecting condemned prisoners who suffer from dementia and a landmark 2012 ruling that banned mandatory life-imprisonment-without-parole sentences for all children 17 or younger. Mr. Stevenson and his staff have won reversals, relief, or release from prison for over 140 wrongly condemned prisoners on death row and won relief for hundreds of others wrongly convicted or unfairly sentenced.

Mr. Stevenson has initiated major new anti-poverty and anti-discrimination efforts that challenge inequality in America. He led the creation of EJI's highly acclaimed Legacy Sites, including the Legacy Museum, the National Memorial for Peace and Justice, and Freedom Monument Sculpture Park. These new national landmark institutions chronicle the legacy of slavery, lynchings, and racial segregation, and the connection to mass incarceration and contemporary issues of racial bias. The monument(s) in Montgomery, Alabama vary. One in particular has the names of 122,000 surnames given to slaves. Another monument offers the Laws of the Land at that time indicating that it was lawful to torture or kill a slave. Lynching was allowed and encouraged.

El Chipolte Latin Market & Restaurant (next to Tidewell & the Battery Store) to the left of Big Lots. Authentic Mexican Food Made Easy

It's been a long time since I brought up this hidden gem of a market/restaurant. If you like to cook Latin food you may need certain spices you can't find at the supermarket. They have it all hanging on a big spice rack.

On another note, only on **Tuesday** do they serve a pork rib special cooked/stewed in a scratch made salsa Verde (not hot at all, yet very delicious). The problem is by 4 or 5 p.m. they are sold OUT of this yummy dish that is served with a big helping of white rice and soupy black beans. I usually go there by 1:30 to make sure I get my fair share. Be very careful when eating this since it is cooked from a slab of ribs and has bones and knuckles hiding underneath the meat. If it feels crunchy-spit it out.

The variety of food selections is so ample you may sit there for a few minutes scratching your head as to what to order. It's all good. Trust me!

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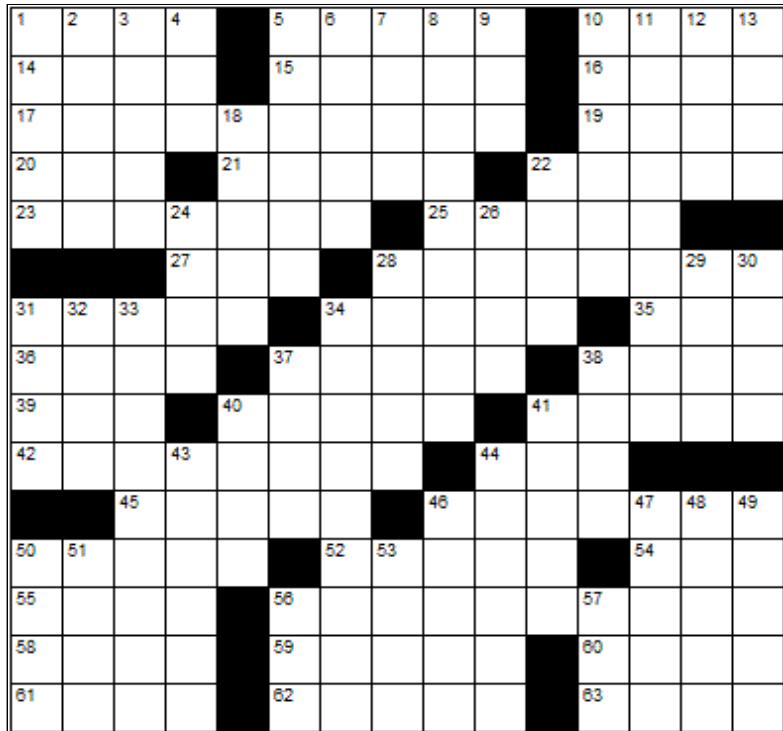
