Joe's checkup is ending, and his doctor asks, "Is there anything else?"

The doctor recommended a simple exercise to determine if it was her hearing. Stand about 50 feet away from your wife, when her back is to you so she can't see you. Keep doing this until you know she heard the question and answered it

After five times his wife spun around and yelled, "For the fifth time, chicken!"

- 6. **The American Revolutionary War** The war for American independence saw approximately 25,000 American patriots give their lives to secure our nation's freedom.








A True Story about three little boys...

...and you may have known 1, 2, or all 3 of them.

If you've been receiving Event Alerts for a while now, you may have read Part 1 of this story. This is Part 2, and sadly it is the final part.



Back in the late 1940s there were three little boys growing up in small-town Plymouth, Indiana. Jim, Kent and Dick were typical youngsters in most ways, doing typical things together like fishing, riding their bikes, and doing their best to stay out of trouble.

As they grew up, they did typical grown-up things. They got jobs, got married, had kids (and a whole line of progeny), and eventually retired.

What was not typical about these three was that they had become life-long friends. In fact, Jim (and his wife, Ruth), Kent (and Donna), and Dick (and Carol) all bought houses in the same retirement community in Nokomis, Florida!

A number of years ago, Jim Doll passed away, and Ruth eventually moved back to Indiana.

More recently, on November 2nd of 2021 to be exact, Kent Mattix passed away at age 83 of congestive heart failure while he and Donna were wrapping up their summer back in Plymouth.

The last of the three little boys, Dick Feltz, passed away last week on Thursday, April 10th. He was 96 years old.

Dick left many Bay Lake friends behind when he departed. They had gotten to know him through his genial participation in many park activities.

each other. The Wednesday Free Computer Clinics where he learned how to access electronic books he downloaded to his Kindle. Saturday morning coffee, donuts, and socializing. Breakfast on alternating Tuesdays with the Romeos, where his sausage, biscuits and gravy meant less to him than the men's good-natured ribbing, exaggerated storytelling, grapevine dissection and enhancement, and skinthickening insult flinging.

Over the years we learned a lot about Dick. He honorably served in WWII and the Korean War. He seemed particularly proud to have been assigned to the team responsible for identifying soldiers who had died in combat. With utmost respect he would regularly speak to those fallen comrades, telling them what he was doing and promising to get them back home to their families for proper burial.

We also found out that Dick used to own an insurance agency in Michigan. He knew more about insurance than any of us could ever hope to learn, and he was always eager to offer advice on saving money and dealing with insurance company representatives.

One thing about Dick that almost nobody knew: he enjoyed writing poetry! Carol has nearly 90 poems he wrote, and she plans to publish them in an anthology.

At our Saturday Morning Coffee just after Dick's passing, Carol read to us one of his recent poems and gave us permission to share it in this Alert.

MIRACLES DO HAPPEN

STUCK IN SPACE - SPACE X - CREW 9 - 2024-2025



After an extended stay aboard the International Space Station, NASA's SpaceX Crew-9 astronauts Nick Hague, Suni Williams, and Butch Wilmore spoke at a news conference at 2:30 p.m. EDT in March, about one week, after landing off the coast of Florida, to discuss their mission in space and answer dozens of questions thrown at them by mostly media folks.

The Crew-9 team made their <u>return to Earth</u> in a SpaceX capsule on March 18, splashing down off the coast of Florida. Their 10 day space station visit turned into a <u>286 day stay</u> due to a malfunction with the shuttle's thrust engine.

According to all three astronauts their shuttle, STARLINER, designed and built by Boeing is perhaps the best shuttle ever built compared to their prior shuttle DRAGON. The Starliner has the ability to self-maneuver or allow the astronauts to man the craft on their own.

The interview was taped and I watched the entire interview on U tube. Very interesting stuff, especially what they experienced.

Butch Wilmore, one of three astronauts on that flight was able to attend/listen to his church services in Houston, TX while in space.

Were they shaken by the delay to return to earth? Not at all. They trained for such an event.

CAJUN MASHED POTATOES - HOMEMADE



A few years back I suggested to folks to go to GOLD RUSH for some of the best fried chicken in the area. Then 2 or 3 years ago, for our Memorial Day lunch I featured POPEYE'S chicken along with mashed potatoes w/Cajun gravy & a biscuit served in individual boxes for convenience.

Since Gold Rush is around the corner, so to speak, I'll usually get a 2 piece fried chicken dinner, SERVED ONLY ON WEDNESDAY'S, along with 2 side dishes, one being their mashed potatoes.

Ahead of picking up my chicken dinner recently I made the Cajun gravy to replicate Popeye's Cajun gravy.

Very simple: Start by purchasing Pioneer brand Roasted Chicken Gravy in an envelope, found at Winn-Dixie, and follow the directions by boiling 1.5 cups of water. Using ½ cup of cold water stir in the chicken gravy mix with a whisk then sprinkle some of the Cajun seasoning into the gravy mix. When the water is hot pour the mix slowly into the boiling water and keep stirring until thick. Conduct a taste test by placing your finger in the hot gravy. Add more Cajun spice if desired. Real Cajun flavor. ENJOY!


